ANN ARBOR, MI (March 7, 2014) —The **University Musical Society** (UMS) presents a diverse April line-up featuring four uplifting performances to close out the 2013/2014 season of live performances. The first weekend marks the return of the UMS Choral Union and the Ann Arbor Symphony Orchestra, conducted by Jerry Blackstone, in a powerful rendition of **Brahms' German Requiem** (Friday, April 4).

The following week, **The Los Angeles Guitar Quartet** brings its energetic stage presence to Ann Arbor with their interpretation of both traditional and contemporary works (Thursday, April 10). A few days later, the internationally recognized **Akademie für Alte Musik Berlin** will enchant audiences in their UMS debut program, featuring works by J.S. Bach and two of his sons (Sunday, April 13).

National Theatre Live closes the 2013-2014 UMS season with the high-definition broadcast of *War Horse*, a searing drama embellished with a stirring musical score and life-size puppets by South Africa's Handspring Puppet Company (Wednesday, April 23). Additional theater cinema broadcasts by both the National Theatre London and the Royal Shakespeare Company will take place through July.

A year after his mother died, Johannes Brahms began to compose a requiem in the German language. Within three years, the work had grown from a choral piece into a cantata and then a seven-movement Requiem for chorus, orchestra, and soprano and bass soloists. It is now considered one of his pinnacle works. Unlike other Requiems, the Brahms work was not composed as a mass for the dead but, rather, as a consolation for those left behind. The UMS Choral Union and Ann Arbor Symphony Orchestra perform this momentous work in Ann Arbor for the first time in over a decade under the leadership of UMS Choral Union music director Jerry Blackstone.

UMS Choral Union:

Formed in 1879 by a group of people with ties to both the University and the city of Ann Arbor who gathered together to study Handel's *Messiah*, the 175-voice UMS Choral Union is known for its definitive performances of large-scale works for chorus and orchestra. In collaboration with the U-M School of Music, Theatre & Dance ensembles in 2004, they released a three-disc set of William Bolcom's *Songs of Innocence and of Experience*, which won four Grammy Awards in 2006. The ensemble frequently collaborates with the

Detroit Symphony Orchestra in addition to its annual *Messiah* performances and concerts of other choral works in Ann Arbor.

Ann Arbor Symphony Orchestra:

Founded as a community orchestra in 1928, then as a fully professional orchestra in 1986, the Ann Arbor Symphony Orchestra celebrated its 85th year in 2013. The orchestra currently performs in the historic Michigan Theater under the direction of conductor Arie Lipsky, known for his popular lectures prior to each performance.

Jerry Blackstone:

Two-time Grammy Award winning conductor Jerry Blackstone serves as Director of Choirs and Chair of the Conducting Department at the U-M School of Music, Theatre & Dance. Devoted to education, he and his students have received first place awards in both the graduate and undergraduate divisions of the ACDA biennial National Choral Conducting Awards competition.

Nadine Sierra:

A graduate of the Mannes College of Music and the Adler Fellowship program at the San Francisco Opera, Nadine Sierra became the youngest soprano to ever win the Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions. She has gone on to perform across the nation, winning first prize at both the 2013 Neue Stimmen International Singing Competition and the 2013 Montserrat Caballé International Singing Competition.

John Relyea:

The expansive repertoire of bass John Relyea has performed under the auspices of the world's most celebrated opera houses, orchestras, and recordings. An alumnus of the Merola Opera Program and a former Adler fellow, he is also the winner of the 2009 Beverly Sills Award and the 2003 Richard Tucker Award. He comes from a musical family; his father is the Canadian baritone Gary Relyea, and his aunt, Deanna Relyea, runs the Kerrytown Concert House in Ann Arbor.
