








WHAT ARE HBCUs?

Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) are institutions of higher education in the United States that were established to primarily serve the African-American community.



HBCU HISTORY

Many of these institutions were founded in the years after the American Civil War mostly in the Southern United States. HBCUs were created as the result of of racial segregation.





Until the Civil Rights Act of 1964, racial segregation was legal in the U.S. This meant that most universities wouldn't admit Black students.

With very limited opportunities for higher learning, HBCUs were formed.



HBCU IN MICHIGAN!

The Lewis College of Business was Michigan's HBCU. It was founded in 1928 by an African American woman, Dr. Violet T. Lewis. It closed in 2018, but is scheduled to reopen in 2022 as the Pensole Lewis College of Business and Design in Detroit with free tuition and programs for Black artists, engineers and business leaders.



HBCUs TODAY

Many of the Black **doctors**, lawyers, engineers and other professionals that assist in the growth and development of our society are HBCU alumni. While these institutions are historically Black, all people may enroll regardless of background or ethnicity.

In 2022, there are **101 HBCUs** across the U.S., and many of them feature a marching band with a vibrant auxiliary.



WHAT ARE MARCHING BAND AUXILIARIES?

A marching band creates a big sound and a visual impact, but the spectacle of an HBCU halftime performance is set by the color and movement of the auxiliary.

A marching auxiliary consists of the danceline, majorettes and color guard.





MARCHING BAND AUXILIARIES - DANCELINE

The danceline is a group of mostly women dancers that is usually featured in a performance within the halftime show.

Their performance showcases highly technical movement and displays of beauty, glamour and unity.

MARCHING BAND AUXILIARIES - MAJORETTES

Majorettes perform an elaborate routine often featuring a baton (or multiple batons).

They are an extension of the drum majors for the band, who lead conduct the band.





DANCE INFLUENCES

Marching auxiliary movement is a celebration of Black culture and therefore is informed by many types of dance, including jazz, hip hop, **Katherine Dunham** technique, West African, **Afro-Caribbean** and many more.

Corp color guard.








HBCU auxiliary performances require vibrant and beautiful flags and wardrobe!

These distinctive items are designed by artists and brought to life by skilled sewers. A majorette uniform might feature 100s of sequins that need to be stitched in place by hand!









